A message from Mrs Davies to all our families.....

It has been a busy week at school once again. All of our after school clubs have started this week and have been well attended. Our children enjoy taking part in these after school and lunchtime clubs, which is wonderful. Thank you to parents for signing up using our School Spider platform. This has been a great success. Just a reminder that there are spaces in a few of our clubs including Mr Mills's Boxercise class. Reading for Pleasure Club takes place each Monday lunchtime for 15-20



minutes and allows your child to visit the school library, choose a book and have some time to read and enjoy the books in the school library. Once our reading ambassadors are selected, these children will be supporting with this club which is a great way for the children to be supported in their use of the school library; choosing a book and having opportunity to speak with older children about books and reading to/with them. It's a little like our buddy system for reading. If you would like your child to have a space, please book this through School Spider. The children engage in this session after lunch and still have time to go out and enjoy playing with friends. We all know the importance of reading and it is important that we foster a love of reading in our children.

A gentle reminder to all children and parents that the school gates open at 8.30am and our classroom doors at 8.45am. We have a number of children arriving at school very early and waiting outside the school gates for long periods and then having to wait on the school playground. We ask that children do not arrive prior to 8.30am unless attending breakfast club with Little Gems.

Thank you to our Year 6 children, led by Mrs Bannister, who have been learning about Fairtrade, during Fairtrade fortnight, and who put together a gift for each class (and the school staff) to invite us to 'Be a Change' in choosing to buy Fairtrade goods. The children have explored other organisations, which have sustainability, community and environment at their core.






