A message from Mrs Davies to all our families.... .

It has been another wonderful week in school. Our week started with our Celebration of the Word where we reflected upon Sunday's Gospel which tells us how important children were to Jesus and how he saw the wonderful qualities in young people and welcomed them with open arms always. As I said to the children, they are all unique and valued and we, as adults, can learn a lot from them just as much as they learn from us and the world around them.

This week, we had a visit from our school SIP, Mrs Mather, who came to visit school to look at the further developments we have made in our History and Geography curriculum. We visited lessons; talked to children and along with Mrs O'Gorman, our Geography and History subject lead, looked at the children's works in their books. It was evident from visiting classrooms that the refinement of the curriculum is positive and impacting the children's learning—children are engaged in their learning; they know and remember more from the strategies of teaching and learning that are confidently implemented consistently across the school and they are curious to find out more. I would like to give a special mention to Year 5, who have completed a final piece of writing linked to their pathways book 'The Frozen North' which is display in the hall. If you get chance, please read their wonderful work.
