## A message from Mrs Davies to all our families....

This week is Parliament Week and this has been marked in school with the children. It has given the children the opportunity to explore what Parliament is and it has been a great way to find out about UK Parliament and children have been given opportunity to discuss issues that they care about. Many classes have taken time to revisit the British Values alongside our school core values. In Year 4, the children explored the British Values and how they can see these around school and in our school community. They then looked at what makes a good leader and made a list of the characteristics of an excellent leader. They also reflected on how they would be a good leader themselves. I think we have lots of leaders, of the future, here, in our school. The children in Year 5 learnt about the Palace of Westminster being the meeting place of UK Parliament and they found out facts about Big Ben (The Elizabeth Tower of the

Palace) - a recognisable landmark in the UK which our children learn about as part of our History and Geography curriculums. Mrs O'Gorman met with our student council today to discuss Parliament week and share the learning that has taken place in each classroom as well to discuss plans for an upcoming PTFA event where the children will be able to vote for their Christmas movie which will be shortlisted by the councillors—democracy in action! The children in Reception watched a video 'The Farmer's Cart' about the value of democracy. In class, there is a voting system where the children can vote for the book that they would like to read at the end of the day.






bring to Christmas this year. It was a lovely opportunity to prepare our minds and hearts in anticipation of

Advent, next week.




years 1 and 2 are looking forward to reading these books over the coming weeks.

## Forest school—Year Four—Thursday 21st November

Supporting their learning about Ancient Greece, Year 4 explored how to make a yo-yo which is believed to be first invented by the Ancient Greeks. The children used saws to cut their wood and sandpaper to ensure that the edges were smooth so that their yo-yo would be effective. They then decorated the edges to look similar to that of an Ancient Greek shield. Alongside this activity, children were also using clay to make Greek Vases using a coil method. The children were then tasked to find natural resources that would help them carve Ancient Greek patterns into their creations.
