## A message from Mrs Davies to all our families.... .




Year 5 have had a busy week as they have been practising for the Neston High School performance with one of the performing Arts teachers from Neston High School, Mrs Hazler. Neston Primary School came to visit as they will be performing, on the night, with our children and the Neston High School pupils. Our pupils also visited Neston Primary school later this week for a further practice. The performance 'Legally Blonde' is on 28th January and a group of our year 5 pupils will perform, on stage, at the Floral Pavilion. I know they are excited to perform and it will be a wonderful opportunity for all. Well done children for taking part and thank you, in advance, to parents for supporting your child to engage in this wonderful opportunity.



Forest school recommenced this week and our Year 6 'crew' carried out fieldwork in our wonderful grounds, inspired by the expedition of Ernest Shackleton, across Antarctica (1914-1916), which the children are learning about in their Pathways to Write text 'Shackleton's Journey'. The children carried out surveys; mapping and measuring the land; collecting and identifying flora and fauna and collating data such as temperature over time. They also worked as a team to build a shelter and boil water in a 'Kelly Kettle' as well as taking photographs with a microscopic camera. Mr Parker, our Forest school leader shared, "Every student did themselves and the school credit. It's really nice to work in such a student led way and it can only be done with the right attitude, behaviour, and buy-in from the pupils. They did really well!" Mrs Bannister said that the children were extremely enthusiastic and gained so much from the session enriching their learning across the curricu-

lum. Well done Year 6; it is lovely to hear that you are engaging so maturely and positively—keep it up! Swimming lessons started again for Year 6 this week, and once again, Mrs Bannister shared that the children are developing so well in skill and confidence, which is wonderful. They value this time and understand the importance of being able to swim as well as it being a recreational activity that they enjoy.
