Forest School—Thursday 30th January 2025—Year Four Class

In forest school, the Year 4 children explored different maps looking at mountain ranges fol-

lowing their geography learning. They then looked at the different parts of a mountain and how they are created. The children were then tasked to build their own mountains with natural resources labelling them with the key features. As part of our science, the

children created a fire and boiled water to test how water evaporates when it is closer to heat and further away, and in different sized containers. The children were brilliant as always and had lots of fun!
