Forest School—Thursday 23rd January 2025

The children in Year 5 braved the weather on Thursday and enjoyed their Forest school session with Mr Parker. The rain may have poured in the school grounds but it certainly didn't dampen the children's enthusiasm for learning in the outdoors. As part of their history learning about the Vikings, the children



made timelines on the playground. They also made Viking Runes. The children also used a Kelly Kettle to boil water and decanted this in different types of mugs and cups with differing insulation and they used devices to take the temperature of the water and recorded this using a graph. The children also made a Viking Ship from materials in the school grounds. The children finished the session with a warm cup of hot chocolate!
