## A message from Mrs Davies to all our families....

It has been 'Design and Technology' week this week and all classes have been busy learning new skills and gaining new knowledge. It has been a joy to visit classes and see the children hard at work and applying the skills learnt to their final product. In Year One, the children have been learning about nurses through time in history. Their DT focus is construction. The children have designed and made their own badge of recognition to honour Florence Nightingale and her contributions to nursing. They have used cutting and measuring skills to assemble their badges and attached a pin onto the back. I was very impressed with the children's concentration and commitment to their project and their badges look wonderful! Our Year 4 children explored the structure of a





volcano and made their own from a cereal box, a bottle and some newspaper. They have worked together to build the volcano shape and made their own Papier Mache to give their volcanoes a hard exterior. They will be painting them once they are dry and adding a lever so that they will be ready to explode in science week using a chemical reaction. Our Year 6 children have carried out some market research and reading around symbols linked to Easter. They have developed and applied their skills in textiles, particularly in sewing, to make their own decorations very successfully. I have seen their final products today and I am very impressed. Our children, in Year two, have focused on exploring freestanding structures. They have looked at making them stronger, more rigid and more stable. Their focused practical tasks looked at using arches or extra pillars to add stability and then they looked at different types of joins in prepara-



tion for designing and making bridges after half term. Year 3 have been learning all about fashion designer Vivienne Westwood and have designed a piece of fabric jewellery influenced both by Westwood's style and what they have learnt about Ancient Egypt. They have practised how to use a running stitch to join two pieces of fabric together and are all looking forward to creating their own piece of jewellery! As well as the children learning new knowledge and skills, in Design and Technology, their learning is linked to other areas of the curriculum which deepens their learning, understanding and their ability to remember more. It is always a joy to see the children

immersed in their learning, in and outside of the classroom. They have worked incredibly hard this half term and made sure that they make every day count. Thank you to our wonderful staff for supporting and challenging our children to reach their full potential and to all parents for supporting their children, with their work at home. Together is better and this contributes to our strong, happy and supportive community.

Thank you to all of the Year 4 parents who attended the meeting this week about the multiplication test in June and to our Year 6 parents for attending the meeting about the SATs in May. We hope you found the meeting useful.

Today, it was a joy to invite some children, across the school, to come together to have a hot chocolate treat and a chat with me in my office. The children were delighted to be chosen in recognition of their hard work and living out our school core values each day. The



children spoke, with enthusiasm and joy, about what they had been up to in class and what they have learnt this half term as well as sharing their plans for half term. Many of them spoke about what they had learnt this week, during DT week, and I was impressed with the knowledge and learning that they shared.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you a very happy and peaceful half term. I hope you enjoy your time together. I look forward to seeing you all after half term. We return on Monday 24th February and school will open at 8.45am.
