




A message from Mrs Davies to all our families....

This week, we have been focusing on the theme for children's mental health week 'Know Yourself; Grow Yourself' and encouraging our children to embrace self awareness and explore what this means to them. The children have engaged in activities throughout the week . We are always encouraging are children to be self aware—knowing what they are good at; their likes and dislikes, what makes them feel joy and was things they find difficult and what makes them feel sad. Understanding emotions and being able to express them is really important. As we build a sense of self, we grow in our ability to connect with others as well as develop or own gifts and talents. Forest School—Thursday 6th February 2025—Year Three Class

Year 3 had another fabulous morning in the forest, this time linking

their session to their science learning all about soil. They explored the different types of soil around the school grounds and discussed their findings. They looked at the different animals/ insects they found in the soil and discussed why they thought they lived there. They used a digital microscope to look at the animals close up in more detail and even used different techniques to try and bring worms to the surface of a given area. Finally, they experimented with different soil types to see what happened when they added water or sieved the soil.
